Pilgrimage | Church Groups

- 10 Days of biblical experience in Jordan & Israel.
- Accommodation plan: 2N Amman, 1N Jericho, 2N Galilee, 4N Bethlehem.
- Arriving to Amman, the tour will spend 2 Nights in Amman covering Nebo, Madaba, Mekawer and Jabbok River. [2 nights]
- The tour then moves to the Salt Valley to with overnight at Jericho. [1 night]
- Jericho, Jordan river baptism site & Dead Sea are toured in this segment.
- From the salt valley through the Jordan valley to the shores of the Sea of the Galilee. [2 nights]
- At the Galilee area the tour will visit sites in Nazareth, Cana, Mt Tabor & churches around the Sea of the Galilee.
- Haifa, Mount Carmel and Caesarea are also covered in the last segment of the tour.
- The tour continues to visit all holy sites in Jerusalem, Ein Karem & Bethlehem. [4 nights]
- The tour will culminate in Jaffa Tel Aviv from where they move to TLV airport for departure.

Day 01 — Arrival in Amman, Madaba

Accommodation: Amman

Meals Included: Lunch & Dinner

- Mid day arrival in Amman.
- Transfer to the Madaba.
- Lunch at Madaba. (Traditional buffet)
- Lunch. [South Asian Buffet]
- Visit the St George Church at Madaba to view the ancient mosaic of the map of Jerusalem.
- Transfer to hotel in Amman. (1 hour, 15 minutes)

Day 02 — Mt. Nebo, Mekawer, Jabbok River

Accommodation: Amman

Meals Included: Breakfast | Lunch | Dinner

- Transfer to Mt Nebo. (45 minutes)
- Tour of the memorial of Moses.
- Transfer to Mukawir. (1 hour)
- Visit the fort of Machaerus at Mukawir, the site of the beheading of John the Baptist.
- Transfer to Jerash. (1 hour, 20 minutes)
- Lunch. [Traditional Lebanese Ouzi]
- Jabbok River, the site of the Jacob's crossing to Canaan. It is also believed to be the the site of Jacob's struggle with God in a human form till dawn, which eventually led to Jacob to be named Israel.

Day 03 — Jordan river Baptism Site, Jericho, Dead Sea

Accommodation: Jericho

Meals Included: Dinner

- Transfer to Allenby Bridge border crossing. (45 minutes)
- Transfer to Qasr Al Yahud - The Baptism site at Jordan river. It is widely believed that Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist at this site on the eastern bank.
- Transfer to Jericho.
- Mount Temptation. Ascend by cable car. [2 way cable car].

- Jericho, the lowest city on earth, is also considered to be the oldest city of human civilization - visit the Sycamore tree & Zacchaeus' House.
- Lunch. (Open Buffet).
- Transfer to Dead Sea - Kalia beach. (30 minutes)
- Dead Sea, soak in the mineral rich waters and experience the Dead sea float.
- Transfer to hotel in Jericho.

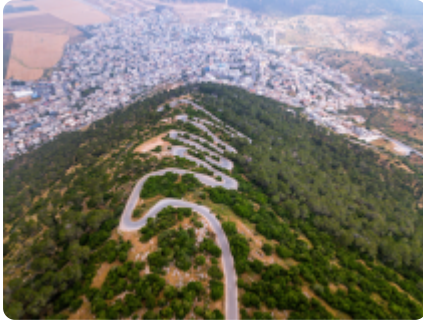

Accommodation: Galilee

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Transfer to Mt Tabor base station. (30 minutes)
- Drive up the Tabor hill in a mini van to visit the Basilica of Transfiguration.
- Transfer to Nazareth. (30 minutes)
- Tour of Nazareth village.
- Basilica of Annunciation & Josef's workshop.
- Lunch at Nazareth.
- Transfer to Cana. (30 minutes)
- Cana - Church of the wedding miracle.
- Transfer to hotel in Tiberias. (30 minutes)

- Visit Kfar Nahum or Capernaum, the city of Jesus and the site of Jesus's ministry.
- Peter's House & Mensa Christy.
- Tour of Magdala, the recently excavated first century city of Mary Magdelene.
- Lunch. [St Peter's Fish lunch]
- Afternoon Boat Ride in the Sea of Galilee on a replica of ancient Galilean boats.
- Transfer to hotel in Tiberias.

- Lunch at Dalyat El Carmel. (Traditional Druze Lunch)
- Transfer to Ceasarea. (45 minutes)
- Brief stop to view Mediterranean Sea & Roman aqueduct
- Transfer to Bethlehem. (1 hour, 45 minutes)

Day 07 — Mt Olives, Gethsemane, Shepherd's field, Bethlehem

Accommodation: Bethlehem

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Transfer to Jerusalem. (1 hour, requires check point crossing)
- Tour of Mt Olives. View the iconic Dome of the Rock from Mt Olives.
- Short visit to the chapel of Ascension.
- Tour the sanctuary of Pater Noster where The Lord's Prayer is embedded in the walls in numerous languages.
- Palm Sunday Road - view from below only, the steep decent being perilous.
- Visit the Basilica at Gethsemane - Church of All Nations and the ancient Olive Garden.
- Transfer to Bethlehem. (30 minutes)
- Lunch. [Traditional Palestinian / Open buffet]
- Shepherd's Field.
- Shopping for Religious Articles.
- Basilica of Nativity & the grotto of Nativity.

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Day 08 — Old City of Jerusalem, via dolorosa, Mt Zion & Western wall

Accommodation: Bethlehem

Meals Included: Breakfast | Lunch | Dinner

- Transfer to Jerusalem. (1 hour, requires check point crossing)
- Tour of the Old City of Jerusalem via Lions' gate. Bethesda Pools - St Anne's, Chapel of Flagellation. Chapel of Condemnation, continuing Via Dolorosa to Calvary.
- Lunch. (Buffet)
- Mt. Zion. David's Tomb & Upper room.
- Walk to St. Peter in Gallicantu.
- Western Wall.
- Dome of the Rock.
- Tour of the Western Wall Tunnels
- Transfer to hotel in Bethlehem. (30 minutes)

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

- Transfer to Ein Karem. (1 hour, requires check point crossing)
- Visit the Church of John the Baptist.
- Transfer to Emmaus (35 minutes)
- Tour of Emmaus Nicopolis.
- Transfer to Jaffa. (45 minutes)
- Transfer to Jaffa via Tel Aviv beachfront (1 hour)
- Farewell Lunch at Jaffa. (Typical Mediterranean salads & seafood grill)
- St Peters Church, the site of the healing of Tabitha.
- Short tour of Jaffa.
- Transfer to the hotel in Bethlehem. (1 hour, 45 minutes)

"Masada is a rugged natural fortress, of majestic beauty, in the Judean Desert overlooking the Dead Sea. It is a symbol of the ancient kingdom of Israel, its violent destruction and the last stand of Jewish patriots in the face of the Roman army, in 73 A.D. It was built as a palace complex, in the classic style of the early Roman Empire, by Herod the Great, King of Judaea, (reigned 37 - 4 B.C.). The camps, fortifications and attack ramp that encircle the monument constitute the most complete Roman siege works surviving to the present day." <https://whc.unesco.org/en/licenses/6>

"Set on the outskirts of old Nazareth, the Nazareth Village is built on ancient agricultural land that boasts the area's last remaining first-century wine press. The original farm has been restored with its ancient wine press, terraces, irrigation system and stone quarry, and exact replicas of first-century houses, a synagogue, a watchtower, mikveh and olive presses have been carefully constructed using the original building methods and materials."

What are the travel requirements?

- Passport valid for at least 6 months from the start date of the tour.
- Entry permit as required for various Nationalities. [Israel's visa policy](#).
- Health insurance valid for the duration of the journey, preferably "cash free" policies.

Who can travel?

- Adult passengers from most countries.
- Minors must be accompanied by an immediate relative/guardian.

Is it safe to travel to Israel?

- Israel is safer than most places in the world.
- Stop watching the TV.

Are credit cards accepted in Israel?

- Yes, all credit cards are accepted in Israel.
- Please check with your service provider too.

Can an insurance policy be purchased in Israel?

- Yes, please write to us to know more.

Are foreign insurance policies accepted in Israel?

- Yes, they are, and it is preferred, because your insurance company is liable to the laws of your country, while local Israeli insurers are not.

Can cash be carried?

- Cash could be carried, but currently it is limited to NIS 12,000 which is about \$3250 at an exchange rate of US\$ 1= NIS 3.6.
- *Passengers carrying currencies whose total value exceeds the above amount are required by Israeli law to make a declaration with the customs at the port of entry.*
